THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK: The sacrament during this pandemic has greater importance due to its nature and character. Christ gave witness to his divinity through the power of healing. In scriptures, we find instances where Christ instructed his apostles and disciples to heal the sick.

James the Apostle gave the formula for the sacrament of the sick in the following words: 'If there is one sick among them let them call the priest of the Church, the prayer made in faith will heal the sick person and tell them one's sins are forgiven.' The anointing of the sick, especially those critically ill, are provided with tangible sign of a possible healing in line with God's plan and above all forgiveness of one's sins. This sacrament fortifies the sick person and brings comfort to family and friends.

The number of people both at home or admitted to hospital is very much on the increase, often ill or very ill due to Covid. This is the time when we are called upon to afford the sick person this wonderful sacrament, irrespective of our views or lack of personal belief. It is the faith of the sick person which is paramount and needs to be respected. Prudence prevails. The final personal gift to a dying person is the sacrament.
