Feast of the Assumption (HOLY DAY of OBLIGATION): The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: History - Celebrated every year on the 15 August the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay - a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a Holy Day of Obligation. The Feast of the Assumption is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally by the sixth century. The feast was originally celebrated in the East, where it is known as the Feast of the Dormition, a word which means "the falling asleep." The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God." The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of his mother, and recounts the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Traditionally variously paces Mary's death at Jerusalem or at Ephesus, where John was living. Eastern Christians, both Catholic and Orthodox, continue to refer to the Feast of the Assumption as the Dormition of the Theotokos today.

FOUNDATION MASS: Foundation Mass is set up for those who look into the future in assuring that prayers are said for their repose, in the light of the efficacious nature of Christ's redemption for the Salvation of Souls. Prayers and in particular the sacrifice of the Mass draws on the infinite merits through His suffering and in particular His resurrection. This means that a Mass is said in the Parish each anniversary for the next twenty five years for the deceased person. The cost is £300. Part of the money contributed goes towards the formation of seminarians. More information could be had from the Parish Priest.

MUSIC: Parishioners involved in Church music make a big contribution to the life of the parish. One is very grateful for such support. The idea is to further explore future needs in this field. In recent years we have seen the creation of a Filipino and an Afro-Caribbean Choir. Only recently we launched a Children's Choir. One must not forget the Traditional Choir that has existed since the creation of the parish. Tony & Viv as a duo have given a great deal of support. This applies to Brother Tom who plays every Saturday night. Last but not least is the School Choir bringing warmth and enthusiasm with them to the service. I would like to say thank you to everyone and wish you a pleasant holiday until we meet again in September.

NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS:

The Bishops of England and Wales are hosting the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage and Congress in Liverpool in September 2018. Eucharistic Congresses are gatherings of clergy, religious and laity which promote an awareness of the central place of the EUCHARIST in the life and mission of the Church.

The three day EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS, titled ADOREMUS (Let Us Adore), will take place in Liverpool in September 2018 and involves every Catholic Diocese in the two counties.



On the first day, there will be a Theological Symposium, which will include workshops for Parish Catechists, RE teachers, Hospital and Prison chaplains, Seminary communities and extraordinary ministers. An anticipated 10,000 pilgrims will gather at the Echo Arena in Liverpool on Day two for six hour stage programme concluding with adoration. On the final day, there will be Pilgrimage Masses and a street procession.

Every diocese will be taking part and one hopes that many will participate in one form or another. There is good reason why our participation should be strong.

The Pilgrimage aims to provide practical resources to develop the Mission of the Church in Prayer, Contemplation and Adoration of the Blessed sacrament.

As a Parish we continue to contribute towards the National Congress by inviting more Parishioners to grow in the daily adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Exposition and Adoration takes place daily from 8.30am - 9.00am.

1st Holy Communion 2019: The Eucharist is central to our faith. Pope Pius the tenth saw the importance of allowing children who have reached the age of reason to be able to participate in the reception of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. This remains the practice in the Universal Church. In our Parish we are very honoured to have responsible parents who coach their children in the faith and support them in the reception of the Sacraments. The preliminary meeting for parents of would be first communicants was held a few weeks ago. For those parents who were unable to attend, enrollment forms are being made available. These are to be found at the back of the Church.

The Parish Programme for the 1st Holy Communion is a two year programme. The first year the children are given the opportunity to visit the Old Testament and the many stories which highlight the history of God's people. The second year the teaching is based on the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Eucharist.

<u>PORTIUNCULA INDULGENCE</u>: A plenary indulgence may be gained once in the parish church on the usual conditions, viz a visit to the church, during which the Our Father and Creed are recited together with a prayer for the Holy Father's intentions, sacramental Confession and Holy Communion. The indulgence may be gained today, the Feast in Assisi of Saint Mary of the Angels.
